Antonia Kyriatzi has been working as an assistant at the Department of Church History of the Faculty of Theology Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (AUTH) since 1986. Her main field of interest is the Ecclesiastical History and Literature of the Church of Greece. She studied at the Theological School and graduated in 1984. She continued her postgraduate studies at the Faculty of Theology of the same University and she has specialized in the subject of History and Literature of the Church of Greece. She submitted her Master thesis in 1991 on the subject "Andreas Papadopoulos Vretos. Contribution to composition of thelogical bibliographies".

She also attended postgraduate studies on the subject of History and Patristics in the Pontifical Oriental Institute (Pontificio Istituto Orientale) and Pontifical Gregorian University (Pontificia Università Gregoriana), Rome. She studied Library Science at the Vatican School, Rome, and was awarded the diploma of Library Science.

In 2007, she submitted her Doctoral Thesis in the Theological School of Aristotle University of Thessaloniki on the subject: *"Ioannis I, Archbishop of Thessaloniki. His life, work and theology (6th-7th c.)"*.

In 2010, Antonia Kyriatzi, after the publication of her work on the subject "Spiritual movement and ideological currents of the nation and Hellenism during the Ottoman empire through the edition of booklets", was elected in the position of Lecturer at the Faculty of Theology at the Theological School of Thessaloniki. In this work, her interest is focused on the role of the Orthodox Church of Greece to the educational and cultural development of the "nation" (millet) under the Ottoman empire, the role of the church that led to social, economic, and ideological changes, whose origins are in the Enlightenment that created conditions for the conflict of traditions and political changes.

In 2017, she was elected in the position of Assistant Professor, after the publication of her work bearing the title: "The church in Greece and the Kazantzakean issue. Historical review based on sources", where the position of the Church of Greece towards the work of Kazantzakis is examined on the basis of archival material information.
