Born in Chalkidiki, Greece, Chysostomos Stamoulis studied Theology at the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki (Greece), and the Universities of Belgrade (Serbia) and Durham (UK). He is the Professor of Dogmatic Theology at the Faculty of Theology of the Aristotle University, and teaches the core module of *Dogmatic and Symbolic Theology*, as well as the following optional modules: *Philocalic Aesthetics of Orthodoxy, Theology and Film, Contemporary Atheism, Science and Orthodox Theology*.

Stamoulis has lectured and held visiting positions in Europe (The Moscow Theological Academy and Seminary; The Centre for Theology and Religious Studies in Lund, Sweden; The "Justinian Marina" Orthodox Theology Faculty in Bucharest, Romania), Asia (St John of Damascus Institute of Theology, Balamand University, Lebanon) and the United States (The Hellenic College Holy Cross, Brookline, Boston USA; The Center for the Study of World Religions, Harvard Divinity School, Boston USA; The Department of History of Art and Architecture, Harvard University, Boston USA; Institute of Eastern Mediterranean Studies, Emmanuel College, Boston USA· "St. Sava" Serbian Orthodox School of Theology, Chicago USA).
